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INTRODUCTION

OVERVIEW

In this report, Hanover Research presents the results of a Private School COVID-19 Response Survey conducted on behalf of EdChoice.

KEY OBJECTIVES

• Understand how private schools are handling the response to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

SURVEY ADMINISTRATION & SURVEY SAMPLE

- The survey was administered online in April 2020 using the Qualtrics platform.
- The analysis includes a total of 771 respondents following data cleaning.
- Results are segmented by school type (Catholic Private School, Non-Catholic, Christian Private School, Other Religious Private School, Nonreligious Private School) in the report.

RESPONDENT QUALIFICATIONS

Must be employed at a private school in the United States.



INTRODUCTION METHODOLOGY

- Sample sizes vary across questions as some questions only pertain to a subset of respondents.
- Conclusions drawn from a small sample size (n<20) should be interpreted with caution.
- Statistically significant differences (95% confidence level) between groups are noted with an asterisk (*).
- After data collection, Hanover identified and removed low-quality respondents.
- "Don't Know or Not Applicable" responses, and equivalent, are often excluded from the figures and analysis in order to focus on respondents who did express an opinion.



KEY FINDINGS

KEY FINDINGS - 1

- Private schools have responded to the pandemic by shifting to <u>online learning with formal curricula</u>.
 - When asked about their current status, nearly all respondents (88%) indicate that their school has shifted to **online learning** with formal curricula.
 - Non-religious private schools are the least likely (of all private school types) to indicate that they have shifted to online learning with formal curricula (68%).
 - The next most common response (5%) is that their school working to support families by **providing some resources and support short of formal curricula**.
 - Less than 5% of respondents indicate that their school has either entirely closed (3%), currently on spring break and plan to resume online (3%), open as usual (1%), or on spring break and plan to close after (<1%).
- Respondents are highly <u>uncertain</u> about the remainder of the school year.
 - Only 10% of respondents expect students to return to classes as usual this school year.
 - Approximately one-third do not expect students to return to classes as usual this school year, and 57% are unsure.
- Private Schools <u>do not</u> have much previous experience with online learning.
 - Nearly half of respondents (45%) report that they **never** offered eLearning to students prior to the current COVID-19 pandemic. Another 26% of respondents report that they only ever offered eLearning a few times or less per school year.
- Private Schools are staying in <u>close contact with parents</u>.
 - Over half (55%) of respondents indicate that their school is communicating with parents **multiple times a week**, and 30% of respondents are communicating with parents **daily** or **multiple times a day**.



KEY FINDINGS - 2

- Private schools expect teachers to work <u>full-time virtually</u>, and they are <u>providing support to special student</u> <u>populations</u>.
 - Approximately two-thirds (65%) of respondents indicate that they are expecting their teachers to teach full-time virtually right now, and 20% expect their teachers to be working part-time virtually.
 - Sixty-two percent of respondents are providing support for students in special education and 20% are providing support for students who are English learners.
 - Only 10% of respondents indicate that they have special student populations but are not providing support for them.
- Respondents are worried about <u>finances</u>, <u>lost enrollment</u>, and the <u>length of the pandemic</u>.
 - At least half of respondents are either "very" or "extremely worried" about **students' families struggling financially** (65%) and **losing enrollment next school year** (51%).
 - At least 40% of respondents are either "very" or "extremely worried" about drops in philanthropic support (44%), collecting tuition for the remainder of the school year (41%), and this crisis lasting into next school year (41%).
 - Compared with catholic private schools and non-religious private schools, Christian (non-Catholic) private schools are *less* worried about collecting tuition for the remainder of the school year, losing enrollment next school year, or drops in philanthropic support.
- Private schools are providing a number resources to assist in online learning.
 - At least half of respondents indicate that their school has offered **Devices for students** (80%), **professional development for teachers around online learning** (79%), and **assistance obtaining internet access for students and their families** (50%).
 - Catholic private schools (86%) are the most likely private school type to offer **devices for students**, and non-religious private schools are the least likely (61%).
 - Catholic private schools (25%) are more likely than any other private school type to offer **meals for students**.



KEY FINDINGS - 3

- The biggest philanthropic priorities right now are <u>financial support for the school</u> and <u>financial support for students and their families</u>.
 - Over half (54%) of respondents rank **Financial Support for Students and their Families** as either the first or second priority that they would ask a potential donor to support.
 - Similarly, 56% of respondents rank **Financial Support for the School** as either the first or second priority that they would ask a potential donor to support.
- Private schools indicate that their biggest need from government is <u>clear guidance about what is expected of schools during the COVID-19 pandemic.</u>
 - A majority of respondents (54%) rank **giving clear guidance about what is expected of schools during the COVID-19 pandemic** as the top (first) priority that state/local governments could do to help their school.
- Private schools rely on multiple sources to get information about COVID-19 and schools.
 - At least half of respondents rely on **stategovernment agencies** (90%), **federal government agencies** (71%), **news media** (62%), **the local public school district** (58%), and **school associations** (50%).
- Respondents have heard of many online learning tools, but so far, they are only using a few.
 - At least half of respondents have heard of **Zoom** (98%), **Google Classroom** (95%), **Khan Academy** (90%), **Facebook Live** (70%), **BrainPop** (69%), and **Blackboard** (57%).
 - At least half of respondents are using **Zoom** (83%), **Google Classroom** (73%), and **Khan Academy** (66%).

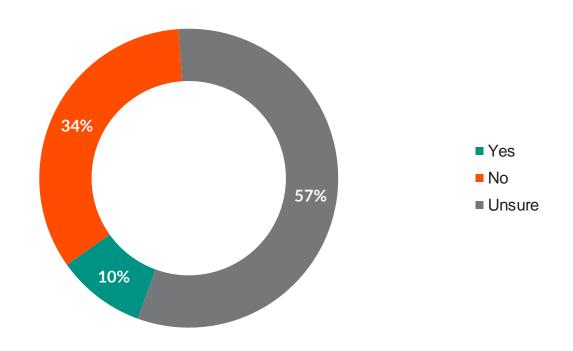

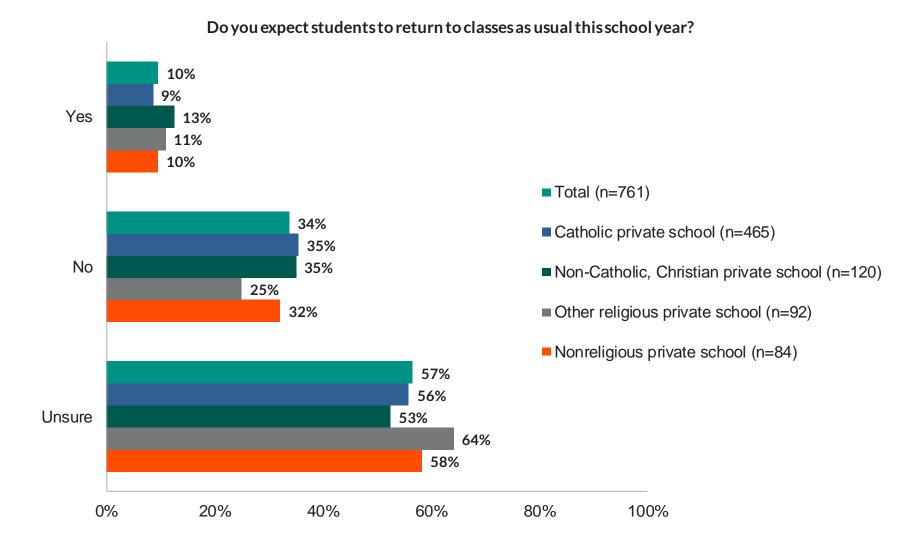
RETURNING TO SCHOOL (OVERALL)

Do you expect students to return to classes as usual this school year?





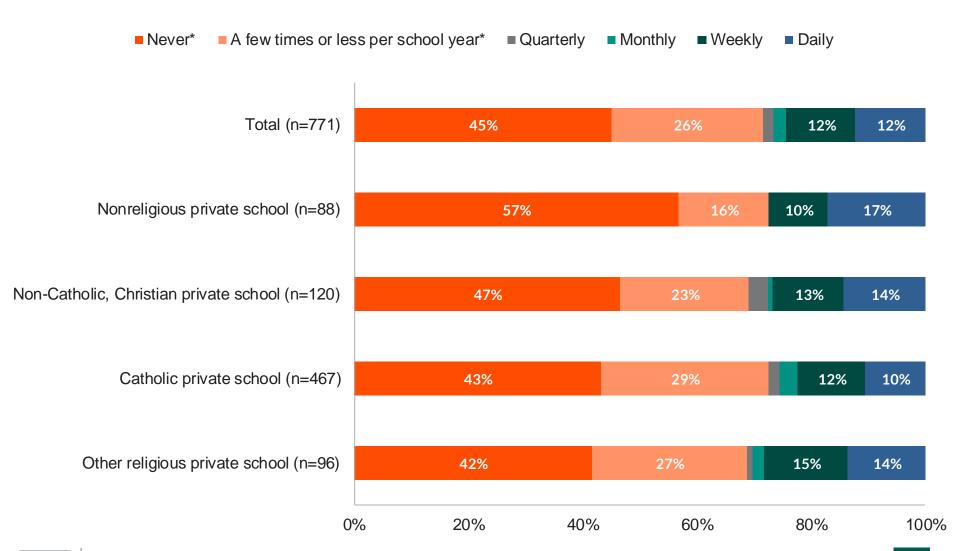
RETURNING TO SCHOOL (BY GROUP)

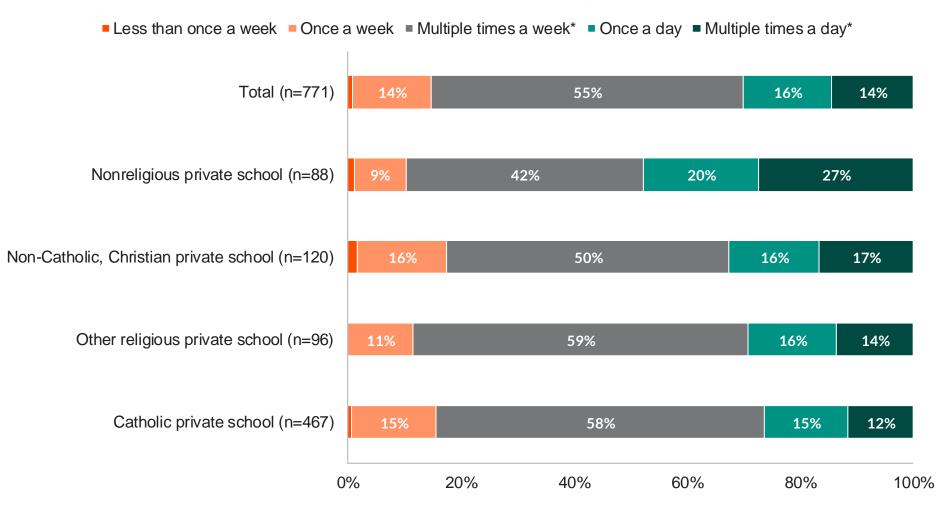
Before the COVID-19 pandemic, how often did your school provide eLearning to your students, if at all?

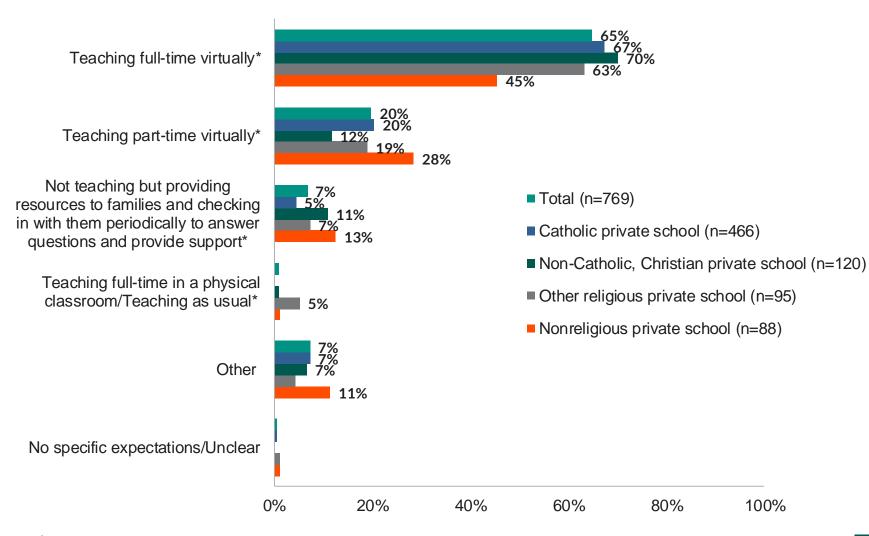
How frequently have you been communicating with parents?

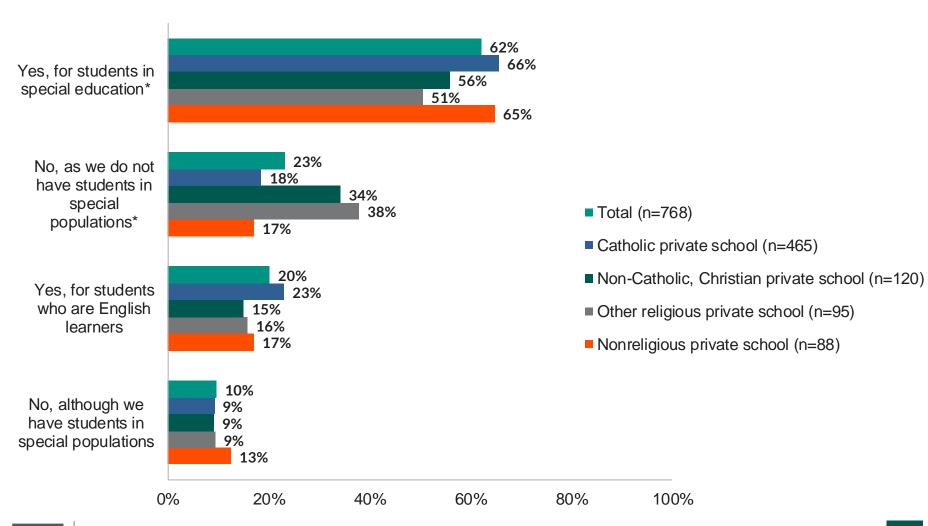
What are your expectations for your teachers right now?

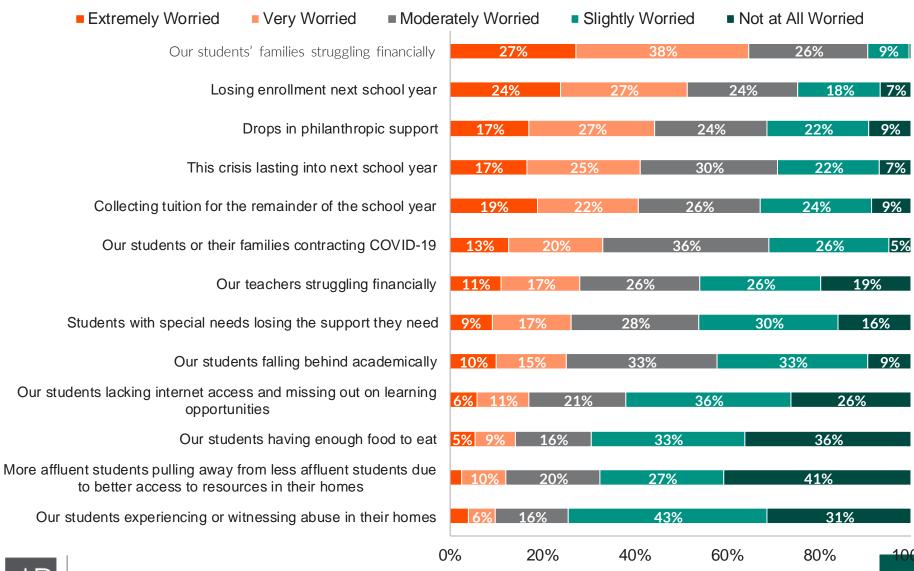
Are you providing support for students who are part of special populations (e.g., special education, English learners)?





WORRIES OVER COVID-19 ISSUES (OVERALL)

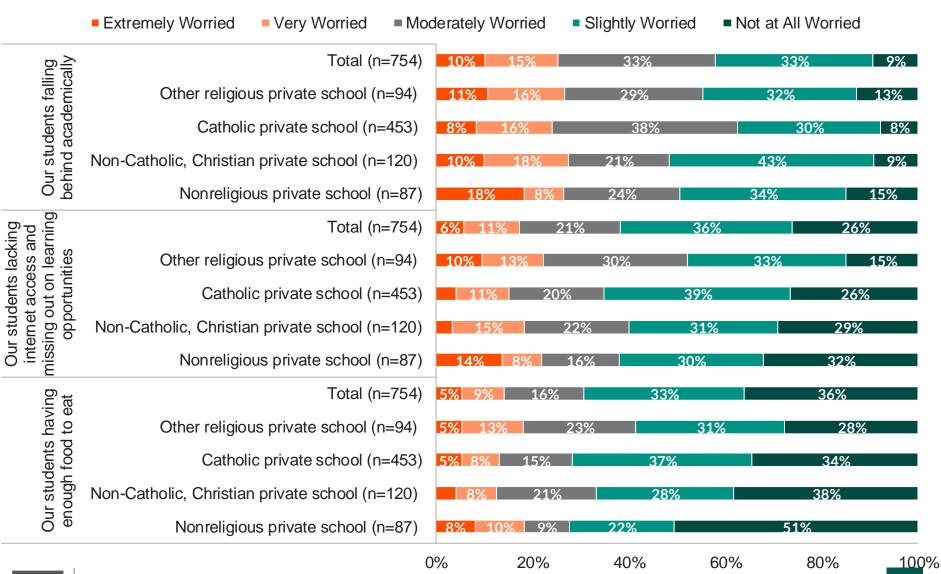
How worried are you about each of the following issues?





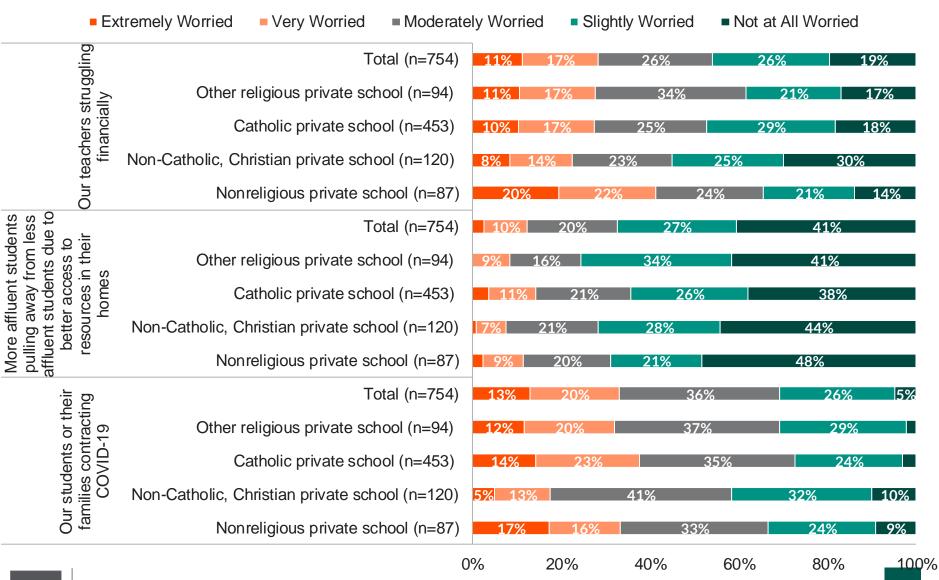

How worried are you about each of the following issues? (by group)





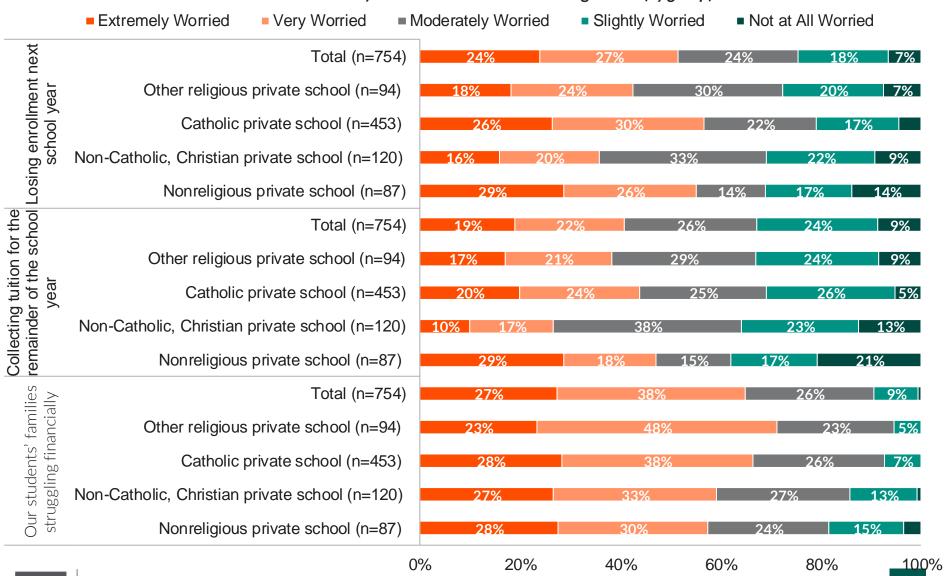
How worried are you about each of the following issues? (by group)

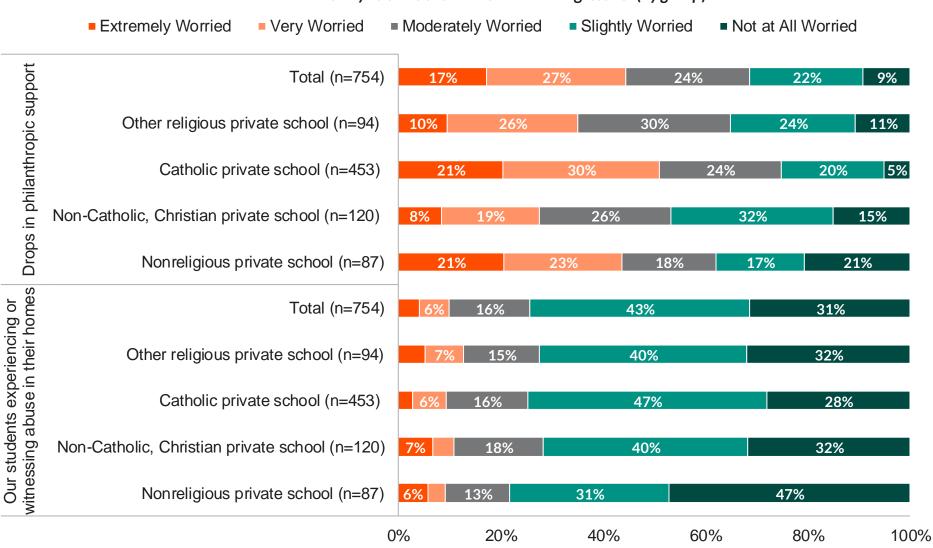
How worried are you about each of the following issues? (by group)





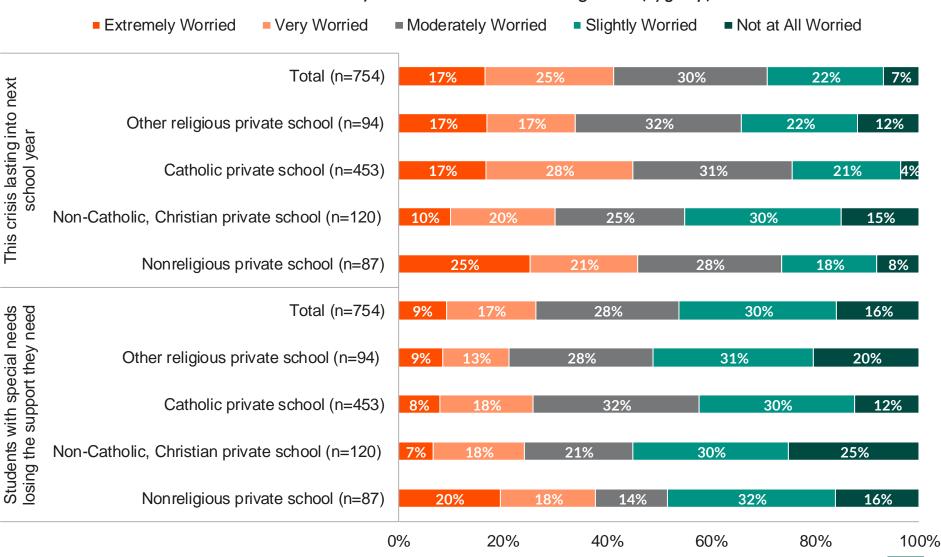

How worried are you about each of the following issues? (by group)





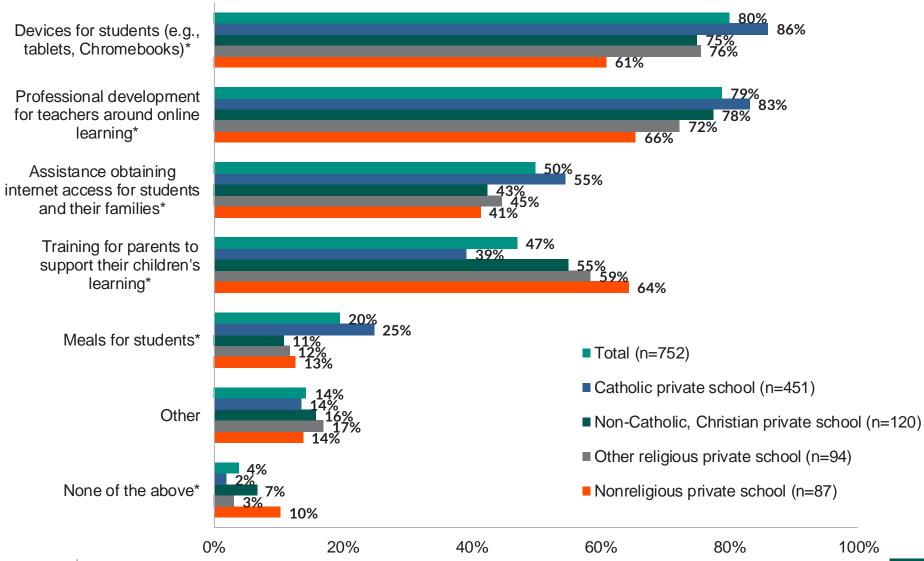

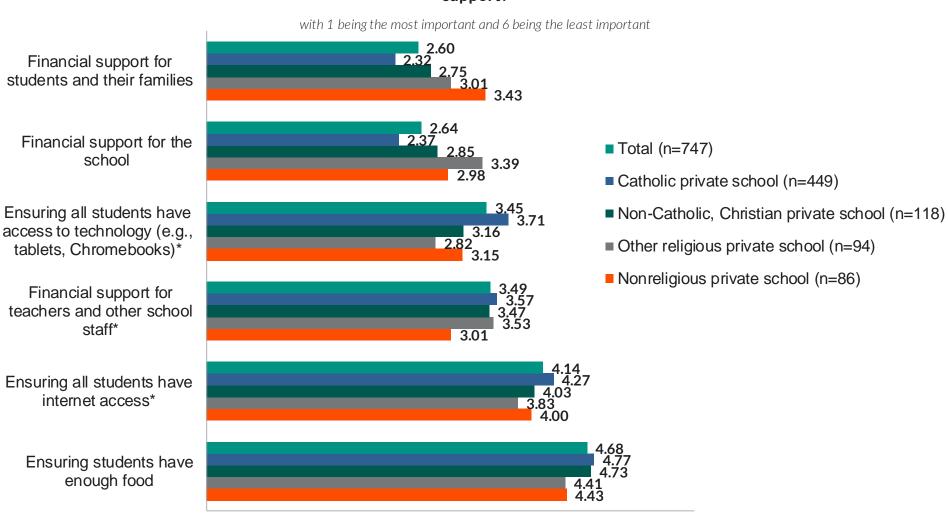
Which of the following resources or support has your school offered?

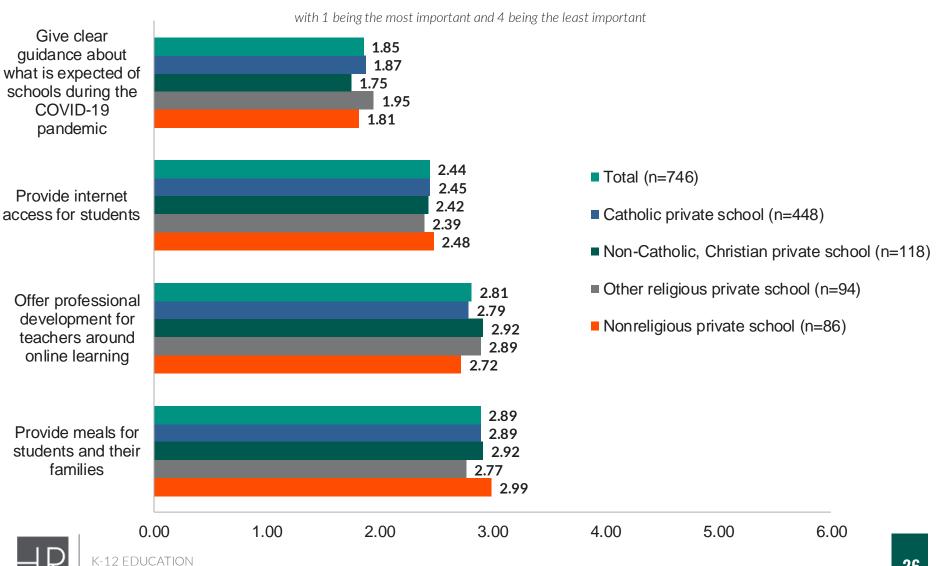

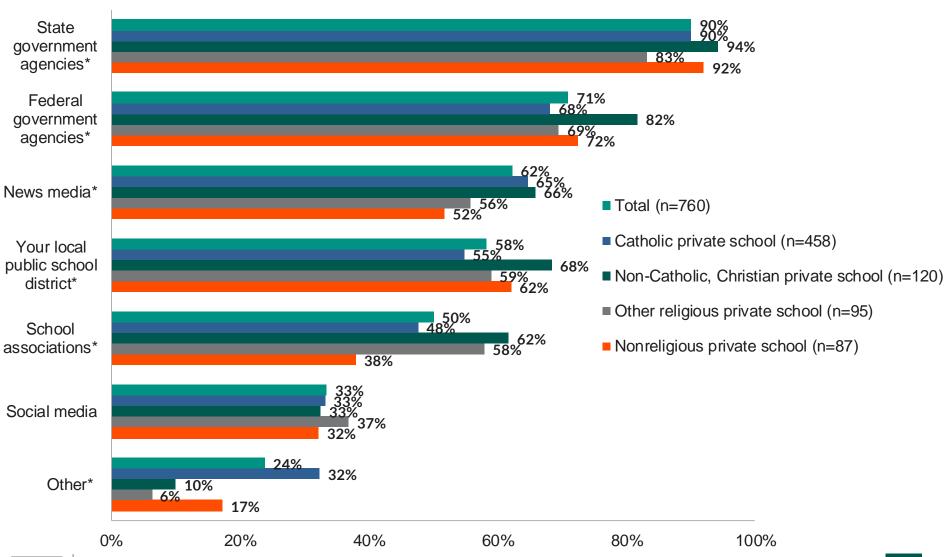

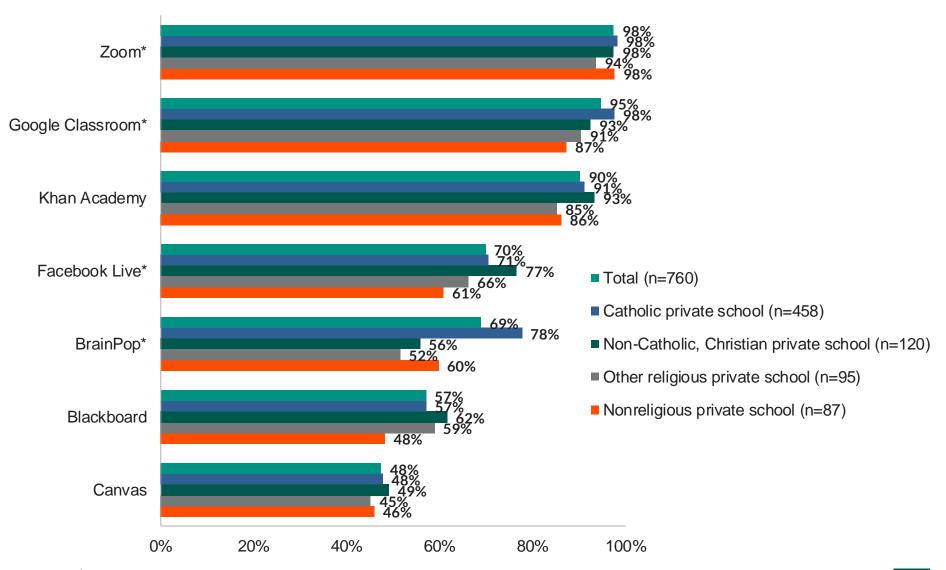

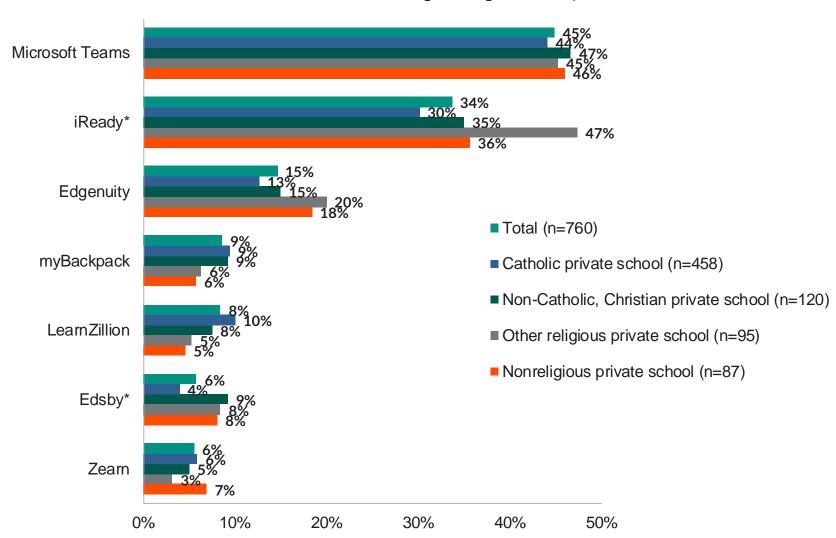
Which of the following learning tools have you heard of?





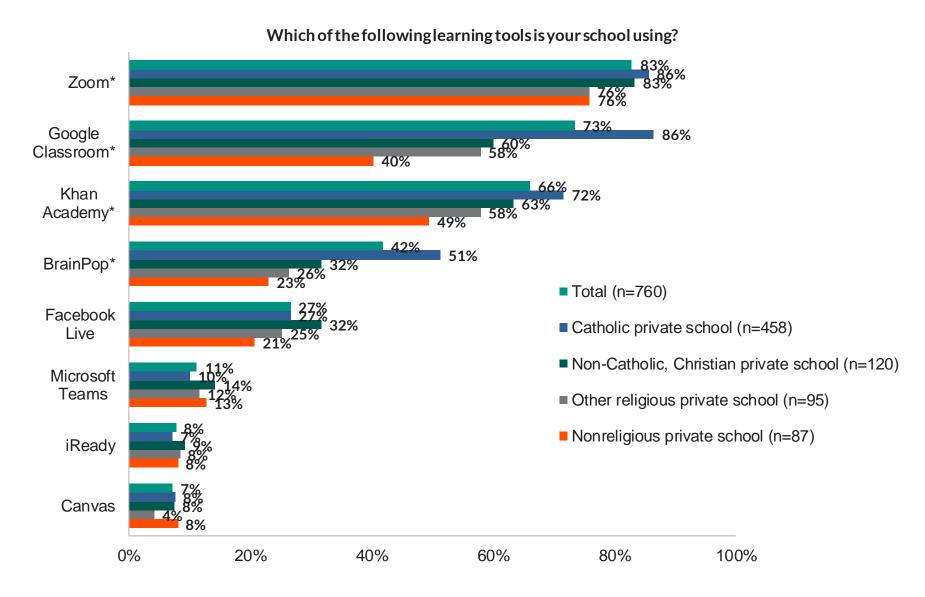

Which of the following learning tools have you heard of?



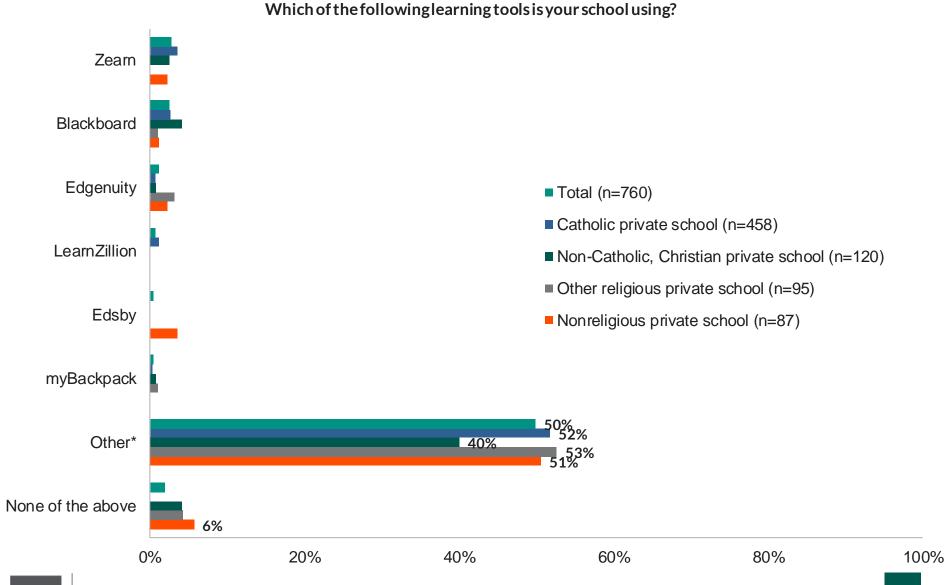


USE OF ONLINE LEARNING TOOLS
