






Arizona Charter and Private Choice Scholarships, 2006-2015

In fiscal year 2012, Scottsdale USD had total school building capacity of about 38,000 students but only had about 25,000 students enrolled, or in other terms, the District was using about 66 percent of its building capacity...Had Scottsdale USD maintained a similar amount of school building space per student as its peer districts averaged, it could have saved approximately \$3.8 million, monies that the District otherwise potentially could have spent in the classroom.

Closed AZ charter schools averaged 4 years of operation and had an average of 62 students enrolled in their final year of operation.


Arizona grants 15 year charters, so parents are initiating the vast majority of closures by voting with their feet.

Weak schools falter, young schools get more experience over time and often either close or get better.

In 2015 Arizona charter students performed much higher than districts on both NAEP and state tests.


